

**REPORT (ABRIDGED) BY THE COMMONWEALTH AND

23 June 2016	Mr X, Ms Y and their son were granted Bridging visas and released from community detention.

**Recent visa applications/case progression**

16 November 2015	The Department of Immigration and Border Protection (DIBP) invited the family to lodge a temporary visa application.
24 March 2016	Mr X and his family accepted DIBP's offer of the Primary Application Information Service.

**Health and welfare**

The family was provided with treatment for physical health issues including migraines and anaemia. They were also provided with treatment and counselling for a range of mental health issues including a history of torture and trauma and depression.

**Case status**

Mr X and his family were granted Bridging visas on 23 June 2016 and released from immigration detention. At the time of DIBP's review the family were awaiting to be assigned a provider to assist them with lodging a temporary visa application.
