

**REPORT (ABRIDGED) BY THE COMMONWEALTH AND  
IMMIGRATION OMBUDSMAN FOR TABLING IN PARLIAMENT**

*Under s 486O of the Migration Act 1958*

This is the third s 486O report on Mr X and his family who remained in immigration detention for more than 54 months (four and a half years).

The first report 1000971 was tabled in Parliament on 12 February 2014 and the second report 1001469 was tabled in Parliament on 17 June 2015. This report updates the material in those reports and should be read in conjunction with the previous reports.

**Recent visa applications/case progression**

The Department of Immigration and Border Protection (DIBP) advised that Mr X, Ms Y and their eldest son Master Z were awaiting the outcome of an International Treaties Obligations Assessment (ITOA). DIBP further advised that Mr X and Ms Y's youngest son Master Q was awaiting the outcome of a Protection visa application and a citizenship application.

**Health and welfare**

The family was provided with treatment for physical health issues and treatment and counselling for a range of physical and mental health issues including depression and anxiety.

**Case status**

Mr X and his family were granted Bridging visas on 25 February 2016 and released from immigration detention.
