Detention history

31 December 2014	Released from prison and detained under s 189(1) of the <i>Migration Act 1958</i> . He was transferred to Facility B.
13 March 2015	Transferred to Facility C.
29 October 2015	Transferred to Facility D.
January 2017	Mr X was released from immigration detention when he departed Australia and returned to Country A.

Visa applications/case progression

1984	First arrived in Australia. The Department of Immigration and Border Protection advised the exact entry and movement dates from that time were unable to be determined from available systems.
23 September 1990	Departed Australia. While offshore, Mr X was granted a Transitional (Permanent) visa.
25 September 1994	Re-entered Australia on the Transitional (Permanent) visa which ceased on 11 March 1997.
11 March 1997	First granted a Resident Return visa (RRV). The last re-grant of an RRV was on 4 July 2002.
15 December 2014	Mandatory cancellation of visa on character grounds under s 501(3)(a).
31 December 2014	Detained under s 189(1) following release from prison.
30 January 2015	Requested revocation of cancellation of visa.
2 September 2015	The Minister decided not to revoke the cancellation.

Criminal history

21 December 2010	Found guilty without conviction of custody of an offensive implement in a public place. Placed on a good behaviour bond for six months.
28 February 2012	Fined \$300 and placed on a bond for eight months for assault occasioning actual bodily harm.
18 April 2013	Convicted of offence E. Sentenced to imprisonment for four years with a non-parole period of two years and six months.

Health and welfare

International Health and Medical Services advised that Mr X received treatment for physical health concerns including gout, chronic back pain, hypertension, and a peptic ulcer.

Case status

Mr X departed Australia in January 2017 and returned to Country A.
