

**REPORT (ABRIDGED) BY THE COMMONWEALTH AND
IMMIGRATION OMBUDSMAN FOR TABLING IN PARLIAMENT**

Under s 486O of the Migration Act 1958

This is the fourth s 486O report on Mr X who remained in restricted immigration detention for a cumulative period of more than 66 months (five and a half years).

The first report 973/12 was tabled in Parliament on 20 March 2013, the second report 1000975 was tabled in Parliament on 29 October 2014 and the third report 1002114 was tabled in Parliament on 3 February 2016. This report updates the material in those reports and should be read in conjunction with the previous reports.

2 February 2016	Granted a Bridging visa and released from restricted detention.

Recent visa applications/case progression

14 July 2015	Mr X provided a response to the Department of Immigration and Border Protection's (DIBP) Notice of Intention to Consider Refusal of his Temporary Protection visa application under s 501 of the <i>Migration Act 1958</i> .
29 September 2015	He was invited to lodge a Safe Haven Enterprise visa application but on 29 October 2015 Mr X notified DIBP he wished to continue with his current application.

Health and welfare

Mr X was provided with treatment for chronic back pain and suspected Marfan syndrome, a genetic condition affecting the connective tissue. He was also provided with treatment and counselling for a range of mental health issues including an opiate dependency, an adjustment disorder, anxiety and depression.

Case status

Mr X has been found to be owed protection under the Refugee Convention and the complementary protection criterion. At the time of DIBP's review he was awaiting the outcome of DIBP's assessment of his response to the Notice of Intention to Consider Refusal of his Temporary Protection visa application. Mr X was granted a Bridging visa on 2 February 2016 and released from immigration detention.
