The first report 1612/13 was tabled in Parliament on 4 December 2013, the second report 1001304 was tabled in Parliament on 24 September 2014 and the third report 1001992 was tabled in Parliament on 18 March 2015. This report updates the material in those reports and should be read in conjunction with the previous reports.

Recent detention history

Since the Ombudsman's previous report (1001992), Miss X has remained in community detention under the care of a contracted service provider. Due to her age she remains under the guardianship of the Minister.

Miss X has been found not to be owed protection under the Refugee Convention and the complementary protection criterion. She is awaiting the outcome of judicial review.
