

**REPORT (ABRIDGED) BY THE COMMONWEALTH AND  
IMMIGRATION OMBUDSMAN FOR TABLING IN PARLIAMENT**

This is the second s 486O report on Mr X and his family who remained in immigration detention for more than 30 months (two and a half years).

The first report 1002510 was tabled in Parliament on 21 October 2015. This report updates the material in that report and should be read in conjunction with the previous report.

**Health and welfare**

The family was provided with treatment for physical health issues including neck and shoulder pain and diabetes. They were also provided with treatment and counselling for a range of mental health issues including anxiety and stress.

Mr X and Ms Y's 13-year-old son Master Z has several medical conditions and remained under the care of Hospital B while the family was detained.

**Case status**

Mr X and his family were granted Bridging visas on 3 February 2016 and released from immigration detention.
