Recent detention history

Since the Ombudsman's previous report (1003402), Mr X has remained in community detention.

Recent visa applications/case progression

12 November 2015	Lodged a Temporary Protection visa (TPV) application.
12 July 2016	TPV application refused.
13 July 2016	Mr X's case was referred to the Immigration Assessment Authority (IAA) for review.
26 August 2016	The IAA affirmed the decision to refuse Mr X's TPV application.

Health and welfare

International Health and Medical Services advised that Mr X continues to receive treatment for chronic hepatitis B infection and was scheduled to attend a hospital for a specialist review in August 2016.

Case status

Mr X was detained on 14 April 2013 after arriving in Australia by sea and has been held in detention for a cumulative period of more than three years.

On 12 November 2015 Mr X lodged an application for a TPV. Mr X's TPV application was refused on 12 July 2016. The IAA reviewed the decision and on 26 August 2016 affirmed the refusal of Mr X's TPV application.

At the date of the Department of Immigration and Border Protection's latest review, Mr X was still within the timeframe to apply for judicial review of the IAA's decision.
