REPORT FOR TABLING IN PARLIAMENT BY THE COMMONWEALTH AND IMMIGRATION OMBUDSMAN

Under s 4860 of the Migration Act 1958

Case overview

- 1. Mr X is aged 23 and is a citizen of Afghanistan. He is of Hazara ethnicity and is a Shia Muslim. He said that he has made two attempts to locate his parents and siblings with the assistance of the Australian Red Cross, but was not successful.
- 2. Mr X arrived in Australia by boat in December 2000 when he was aged 16. He was detained under s 189(2) of the *Migration Act 1958* and placed at Woomera Immigration Reception and Processing Centre. In February 2002 he was transferred into Alternative Detention under foster care arrangements of the South Australian Department of Human Services.
- 3. The Department's (DIAC) decision to refuse Mr X's application for a Protection Visa (PV) in April 2001 was affirmed by the Refugee Review Tribunal (RRT) in July 2001. He unsuccessfully sought judicial review at the Federal Court and Full Federal Court. A s 48B request resulted in the Minister allowing Mr X a further PV application. The PV application was refused and he successfully sought merits review at the RRT (June 2005). On 1 August 2005 Mr X was granted a Temporary Protection Visa (TPV) and released from immigration detention.

Ombudsman consideration

- 5. Ombudsman staff interviewed Mr X on 25 August 2006.

Key issues

Attitude to removal

6. Mr X stated that did not want to return to Afghanistan as he says he fears persecution from the Taliban and ethnic Pashtuns as a result of his Hazara ethnicity. He also fears persecution from the Hazara because he would be considered an infidel and a traitor as a result of having been to Australia and fleeing during the war. He was attending a Catholic school and believes that as a result of this and not maintaining his Muslim faith, the Mullahs in Afghanistan would consider him an apostate and he may be killed.

Ombudsman assessment/recommendation

7. The Ombudsman notes that Mr X is now the holder of a TPV and makes no recommendations in this report.
