13 February 2014	Bridging visa cancelled under s 116 following criminal charges. She was re-detained under s 189(1) and transferred to Adelaide Immigration Transit Accommodation (ITA).
3 March 2016	Granted a Bridging visa and released from community detention.

6 February 2014	Ms Y was arrested and charged with criminal offences relating to theft and deception. All charges were withdrawn.
