

**REPORT (ABRIDGED) BY THE COMMONWEALTH AND  
IMMIGRATION OMBUDSMAN FOR TABLING IN PARLIAMENT**

*Under s 486O of the Migration Act 1958*

This is the fourth s 486O report on Mr X and his family who remained in immigration detention for more than 54 months (four and a half years).

The first report 1578/13 was tabled in Parliament on 4 December 2013, the second report 1001415 was tabled in Parliament on 29 October 2014 and the third report 1002182 was tabled in Parliament on 9 September 2015. This report updates the material in those reports and should be read in conjunction with the previous reports.

**Recent detention history**

2 October 2015	Mr X, Ms Y and their two children were granted Bridging visas and released from community detention.

**Recent visa applications/case progression**

The Department of Immigration and Border Protection (DIBP) advised that it was reassessing the family's protection claims as part of an International Treaties Obligations Assessment (ITOA).

**Health and welfare**

Ms Y was provided with treatment for rheumatoid arthritis. The family was provided with treatment and counselling for a range of mental health issues including behavioural concerns, depression and anxiety.

**Case status**

Mr X and his family have been found not to be owed protection under the Refugee Convention and the complementary protection criterion. At the time of DIBP's review they were awaiting the outcome of an ITOA.  Mr X and his family were granted Bridging visa on 2 October 2015 and released from immigration detention.
