

ASSESSMENT BY THE COMMONWEALTH OMBUDSMAN FOR TABLING IN PARLIAMENT

Under s 486O of the Migration Act 1958

This is the third s 486O assessment on Mr X, Ms Y and their son who remained in immigration detention for more than 42 months (three and a half years). The previous assessment 1001776-O was tabled in Parliament on 23 November 2016. This assessment provides an update and should be read in conjunction with the previous assessments.
