REPORT BY THE COMMONWEALTH AND IMMIGRATION OMBUDSMAN FOR TABLING IN PARLIAMENT

Under s 4860 of the Migration Act 1958

This is the second s 486O report on Mr X and his family who remained in immigration detention for more than 30 months (two and a half years).

The first report 1001943¹ was tabled in Parliament on 17 June 2015. This report updates the material in that report and should be read in conjunction with the previous report.

Detention history

17 October 2012	Detained under s 189(3) of the <i>Migration Act 1958</i> after arriving in Australia aboard SIEV 485 <i>Opaque</i> .

Visa applications/case progression

The Department of Immigration and Border Protection (DIBP) advised that prior to being released from detention, Mr X and his family were part of a cohort who had not had their protection claims assessed as they arrived in Australia after 13 August 2012 and the Minister had not lifted the bar under s 46A.

Health and welfare

Mr X

DIBP did not provide an International Health and Medical Services (IHMS) Health Summary Report for Mr X for the period 31 October 2014 to 30 April 2015.

¹ Mr X and his family were previously reported on in a group report of people who arrived on Suspected Illegal Entry Vessel (SIEV) 485 *Opaque* and were detained on 17 October 2012.

Ms Y

IHMS advised that Ms Y did not require treatment for any mental health concerns.		
2 December 2014	IHMS reported that Ms Y's pregnancy was confirmed with an expected due date of 27 May 2015 and she was referred for antenatal care.	
	IHMS advised that her pregnancy was complicated as she was diagnosed with a low thyroid blood level and gestational diabetes. She was monitored by the general practitioner and provided with treatment as required.	

Master Z

DIBP did not provide an IHMS Health Summary Report for Master Z for the period 7 November 2014 to 30 April 2015.		
1 March 2015	A DIBP Incident Report recorded that Master Z was admitted to hospital as he was experiencing chest pain and severe coughing. Hospital staff advised that Master Z possibly had pneumonia. No further information was provided.	

Ombudsman assessment/recommendation

Mr X and his family were granted Bridging visas on 2 July 2015 and released from immigration detention.

The Ombudsman notes that Mr X and his family were detained on 17 October 2012 after arriving in Australia and were held in detention for over two and a half years before being granted Bridging visas. The Ombudsman further notes that, at the time of DIBP's review, processing of the family's claims for protection had not commenced.

The Ombudsman recommends that the Minister lift the bar under s 46A and processing of the family's protection claims commence as soon as possible.
