Recent visa applications/case progression

The Department of Immigration and Border Protection (the department) advised that Mr X has been found not to be owed protection under the Refugee Convention and complementary protection criterion.

At the time of the department's review Mr X was awaiting the outcome of judicial review by the Federal Circuit Court of the Refugee Review Tribunal's decision to affirm the refusal of his Protection visa application.

Mr X did not require treatment for any major physical or mental health issues.

Mr X has been found not to be owed protection under the Refugee Convention and the complementary protection criterion. At the time of the department's review Mr X was awaiting the outcome of judicial review.
