

## ASSESSMENT BY THE COMMONWEALTH OMBUDSMAN FOR TABLING IN PARLIAMENT

*Under s 486O of the Migration Act 1958*

This is the first s 486O assessment on Mr X who remained in immigration detention for more than 24 months (two years).

### Detention history

1 June 2015	Detained under s 189(1) of the <i>Migration Act 1958</i> following his release from a correctional facility. He was transferred to Villawood Immigration Detention Centre.
29 June 2015 – 28 October 2015	Transferred three times between various immigration detention facilities.
June 2017	Voluntarily departed Australia.

### Visa applications/case progression

Mr X first arrived in Australia in February 1996 on a tourist visa and departed Australia in December 1996. He last arrived in Australia on 4 August 2008 on an electronic travel authority visa and was subsequently granted further visas, including a carer visa.	
28 May 2015	Carer visa cancelled under s 501 following criminal convictions.
21 June 2015	The Minister decided not to revoke the decision to cancel Mr X's visa under s 501.
13 April 2017	The Federal Court dismissed Mr X's application for judicial review.

### Criminal history

March 2015	Convicted of stalking, assault and property damage offences and contravening an apprehended domestic violence order. He was sentenced to one year imprisonment with a non-parole period of three months.

### Health and welfare

International Health and Medical Services (IHMS) advised that Mr X received treatment for anxiety and associated sleep concerns and reduced appetite.	
IHMS further advised that Mr X received treatment for physical health concerns, including haemorrhoids.	

**Case status**

Mr X was detained on 1 June 2015 following his release from a correctional facility and remained in an immigration detention facility for more than two years.

Mr X was released from immigration detention when he voluntarily departed Australia in June 2017.
