Detention history

9 March 2015	Detained under s 189(1) of the <i>Migration Act 1958</i> following his release from a correctional facility. He was transferred to Villawood Immigration Detention Centre.
21 May 2015 – 3 November 2015	Transferred three times between various immigration detention facilities.
March 2017	Voluntarily departed Australia.

Visa applications/case progression

Mr X first arrived in Australia on a business short stay visa on 21 January 1997 and was subsequently granted multiple further visas, including a permanent partner visa. He departed Australia on multiple occasions and last arrived in Australia on 25 April 2013 on a resident return visa.

6 February 2015	Resident return visa cancelled under s 501 following criminal convictions.
29 February 2016	A delegate of the Minister decided not to revoke the decision to cancel Mr X's visa under s 501.
19 August 2016	The Administrative Appeals Tribunal affirmed the delegate's decision not to revoke the cancellation of Mr X's visa.
3 February 2017	The Federal Court dismissed Mr X's application for judicial review.
21 February 2017	Requested removal from Australia.

Criminal history

December 2014	Convicted of fraud offences and sentenced to three years imprisonment

Health and welfare

International Health and Medical Services advised that Mr X received treatment for physical health concerns, including type 2 diabetes and associated kidney damage.

Mr X's brother, sister-in-law and niece are Australian citizens.

Case status

Mr X was detained on 9 March 2015 following his release from a correctional facility and remained in an immigration detention facility for more than two years.

Mr X was released from immigration detention when he voluntarily departed Australia in February 2017.
