Recent detention history

Since the Ombudsman's previous report (1003501), Mr X remained in community detention.		
28 October 2016	Granted a Safe Haven Enterprise visa (SHEV) and released from detention.	

Recent visa applications/case progression

9 October 2015	Lodged a SHEV application which included his older brother ¹ as a dependent.
11 April 2016	The Department of Immigration and Border Protection (the department) advised that Mr X was not considered for the grant of a Bridging visa while he was a minor.
28 October 2016	Granted a SHEV.

Health and welfare

International Health and Medical Services advised that Mr X did not require treatment for any major physical or mental health issues.

Case status

Mr X was detained on 12 October 2013 after arriving in Australia by sea and was held in detention for more than three years.

On 28 October 2016 Mr X was granted a SHEV and released from detention.

¹ Mr X's brother, Mr Y arrived in Australia by sea on 3 November 2012. He was granted a Bridging visa on 28 January 2015 and released from detention.
