22 October 2015	Mr X, Ms Y and their two children were granted Bridging visas and
	released from community detention.

Recent visa applications/case progression

28 May 2015	Mr X and his family were found not to be owed protection.
5 June 2015	Mr X and his family appealed the decision to the Refugee Review Tribunal (RRT).

Health and welfare

Ms Y was provided with antenatal support following a positive pregnancy result.

The other three family members did not require treatment for any major physical or mental health issues.

Case status

Mr X and his family have been found not to be owed protection under the Refugee Convention and the complementary protection criterion. At the time of the Department of Immigration and Border Protection's review the family was awaiting the outcome of an RRT appeal.

The family was granted Bridging visas on 22 October 2015 and released from immigration detention.
