The department advised that, following the request, Mr X was held in Prison A under s 189 for the purpose of maintaining the safety and good order of detention facilities. |

Criminal history

Mr X was identified as a person of interest to the department and the Australian Federal Police in relation to his involvement in a disturbance at Christmas Island IDC on 8 November 2015.

14 October 2016

Mr X was sentenced to six months imprisonment for burglary and six months imprisonment for damage, both sentences to be served concurrently. The sentences were backdated to 29 July 2016, with a release date of 28 January 2017. Mr X was also placed on a \$1000 good behaviour bond for six months for a trespass offence.

¹ The department's 30-month review on Mr was due by May 2016. The department advised that the delay in provision of this review was due to an administrative error.

Health and welfare

The department advised that Mr X's health and welfare needs were being provided for by the Department of Corrective Services in the state in which he was located.

Case status

Mr X has been found not to be owed protection under the Refugee Convention and the complementary protection criterion and has been held in restricted detention for more than three years. At the time of the department's latest review Mr X was awaiting the outcome of judicial review.
