Health and welfare

International Health and Medical Services advised that Ms X was confirmed to be pregnant on 12 June 2017 and referred to an antenatal clinic.

Other matters

Ms X resides with her husband, who is a permanent resident, and her daughter, who is an Australian citizen.

Case status

Ms X was detained on 18 June 2010 after arriving in Australia by sea and has remained in immigration detention, both in a detention facility and the community, for more than seven and a half years.

On 31 August 2017 the Minister lifted the bar under s 46A to allow Ms X to apply for a SHEV and on 22 September 2017 Ms X lodged a SHEV application.

Ms X was granted a bridging visa on 16 February 2018 and released from immigration detention.
