Recent detention history

19 October 2016	Granted a Bridging visa and released from detention.		

Recent visa applications/case progression

22 February 2016	The Department of Immigration and Border Protection (the department) notified Mr X that he was eligible to receive the Primary Application Information Service (PAIS) to assist him with lodging a temporary visa application. On 1 March 2016 Mr X declined the PAIS offer.
7 April 2016	The department re-issued an invitation for Mr X to lodge a temporary visa application.
20 April 2016	The department granted Mr X a further month to lodge a temporary visa application.
19 October 2016	Granted a Bridging visa.

Other legal matters

Mr X entered a plea of not guilty to a charge of taking part in a riot.
His matter was listed for summary hearing in a Magistrates Court
from 2 May 2016 to 12 May 2016.

Health and welfare

International Health and Medical Services (IHMS) advised that Mr X continued to be monitored on a hepatitis B care plan. IHMS further advised that Mr X had a long history of ear infections and an eardrum perforation and received treatment for an ear infection. He attended an audiology assessment and was referred for review with an ear, nose and throat specialist. The review was pending at the time of IHMS's report of 24 March 2016.

Case status

Mr X was granted a Bridging visa on 19 October 2016 and released from immigration detention.

Mr X was detained on 8 May 2013 after arriving in Australia by sea and was held in detention for over three and a half years before being granted a Bridging visa.

On 29 September 2015 the Minister lifted the bar under s 46A to allow Mr X to apply for a temporary visa. On 1 March 2016 Mr X declined an offer of PAIS assistance. On 20 April 2016 the department granted him an extension of one month in which to lodge a temporary visa application.
