| <p>Mr X was provided with treatment for physical health issues including hepatitis C, chronic back pain and a fracture from an alleged assault for which he required hospitalisation.</p> <p>He also received treatment and counselling for a range of mental health issues including mixed anxiety and depressive disorder, a history of torture and trauma, and an adjustment disorder. A psychiatrist recommended in November 2016 that Mr X be placed in community detention as his symptoms had not improved.</p> |
