6 October 2016	Temporary Protection visa (TPV) application refused.
8 December 2016	The Immigration Assessment Authority affirmed the decision to refuse Mr X's TPV application.
15 December 2016	Mr X signed a request for voluntary removal.

Health and welfare

Mr X was provided with treatment for physical health issues including hepatitis C, chronic back pain and a fracture from an alleged assault for which he required hospitalisation.

He also received treatment and counselling for a range of mental health issues including mixed anxiety and depressive disorder, a history of torture and trauma, and an adjustment disorder. A psychiatrist recommended in November 2016 that Mr X be placed in community detention as his symptoms had not improved.

Case status

Mr X was released from restricted detention when he voluntarily departed Australia and returned to Country A.
