Mr X first arrived in Australia with his parents in December 1990 as an exempt non-citizen. Since June 1992, he continued to reside in Australia.		
November 2003	Granted a visa.	
January 2016	Visa mandatorily cancelled under s 501.	
January 2016	Mr X lodged a request for revocation of the cancellation of his visa. In September 2016 a delegate of the Minister decided not to revoke the decision to cancel Mr X's visa under s 501.	
September 2017	The Administrative Appeals Tribunal affirmed the delegate's decision.	
November 2017	Applied to the Federal Circuit Court for judicial review. The matter was adjourned on multiple occasions and discontinued at Mr X's request in February 2018.	

Criminal history
