International Health and Medical Services advised that Mr X and his family did not require treatment for any major physical or mental health issues since its previous report to the Ombudsman.

Case status

Mr X and his family have been found not to be owed protection under the Refugee Convention and the complementary protection criterion. The family was awaiting the outcome of a reconsideration by the RRT at the time of the latest report from the Department of Immigration and Border Protection.

Mr X and his family were granted Bridging visas on 9 April 2015 and released from immigration detention.
