Visa applications/case progression

The Department of Immigration and Border Protection (the department) advised that Mr X has been found not to be owed protection under the Refugee Convention and the complementary protection criterion. Mr X has no outstanding matters before the department, courts or tribunals and is on a removal pathway.

Health and welfare

Mr X was provided with treatment and counselling for a range of mental health issues including a history of torture and trauma.

Case status

Mr X was granted a Bridging visa on 19 October 2016 and released from immigration detention.
